

Q. What days and times are summer camp held?

A. Camp runs from 9:00 am - 3:00 pm | August 12th - 16th, 2024

Q. Where is Summer Circus Camp being held?

A. Camp is under the big top tent in Prospect Park in Troy, New York.

Q. Is after-care provided?

A. Yes, after-care is available from 3:00 - 5:30 pm for \$10 per hour.

Q. What if I am more then 15 minutes late to pick up my child.

A. Camp staff will be on site until 5:30 pm. We encourage participants to sign up for after care in advance, however, we are aware unexpected things occur. If you are more then 30 minutes late to pick up your child, you will be charged for after-care.

Q. Where do I drop off and pick up my child?

A. Camp will take place in a tent in Prospect Park. You or an authorized guardian will need to sign your child in and out from camp each day.

Q: What should my child wear to circus camp?

A. Circus kids should wear athletic-wear, nothing loose or baggy, leggings and pants preferred (*Example: t-shirts* should not go over the camper's head if they cartwheel or go upside down for instance). no jewelry, hair tied back, socks & shoes.

Q: What should my child bring to camp every day?

A: Healthy lunch, snacks, and a refillable water bottle with your child's name on it.

Q: Can my child bring a cell phone?

A. Cell phones will be collected and kept in a secure location during camp. They can be accessed in case of emergency and will be returned when a child is signed out of camp.



Q. Is there a final performance?

A. Parents / guardians are invited to the tent for a final presentation at 2pm on Friday, August 16th.

Q. If my child becomes ill or cannot attend camp is there a refund?

A. A full refund for camp is available until June 15th, 50% refund is available until July 15th. Cancellation and refunds after that will be addressed on a case-by-case basis.

Q. Do you have a policy for COVID?

A. We are mask optional at Circus Camp. Everyone should be able to attend and participate in a way that feels safe for them. Please do not attend camp if you have tested positive within four days of attending camp, or have a fever and/or other severe symptoms within 24 hours of camp.

Q. How are injuries and illness handled?

A. We have a qualified nurse on site to handle all medical incidents.

Q: What is a typical day like at circus camp?

A. The typical day begins with a warm-up and group stretch, one or two warm-up circus activities (*like circus relay, low wire, unicycle, trampoline, hula hooping, or juggling*) snack, showcase act rehearsal, lunch, theatre games, arts and circus crafts, showcase act rehearsal, snack, check-out and group games, dismissal.
